NPC does not offer an anthropology degree, but students interested in pursuing a degree in anthropology should fulfill the Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) requirements for an Associate of Arts degree (AGEC-A) and plan to transfer to another institution to complete a bachelor's degree in anthropology.
