### History Program Map – 2024-2025 Catalog

NPC does not offer a history degree, but students interested in pursuing a degree in history should fulfill the Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) requirements for an Associate of Arts degree (AGEC-A) and plan to transfer to another institution to complete a bachelor’s degree in history.

Fifteen to Sixteen-credit-hour blocks are suggested for full-time students but these may be adjusted based on individual needs.
