Possibly the strongest professional development activities in nursing would be the Nursing Educators Bootcamp held in Albuquerque, NM each year in January. Every faculty member has attended this bootcamp at least once most frequently sponsored by the College's Professional Development Fund. Three nursing faculty members attended the National League for Nursing Convention in Phoenix 10/07. Two massage therapy faculty members attended the American Massage Therapy Association Convention in Phoenix 10/08. Taking advantage of national conferences when they are close is evidence of responsible stewardship of professional development funds. Nursing encourages faculty to attend two professional development events each year: one addressing development of teaching qualities and one focusing on nursing skill development. In the past 3 years, 3 faculty members have completed graduate degrees and 4 faculty members are currently enrolled in graduate studies. All faculty are encouraged to participate in the Instructional Skills Workshop.
