

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


# NPC would like to reward <u>YOU</u> for your academic achievement

- 3. Your inclusion in the President's Scholars program is **noted on your transcript**, in various forums and <u>recognized</u> at graduation.

## **President's Scholar Eligibility**

To be eligible, you must have graduated with a 3.5 GPA or better from a Navajo or Apache county high school (class rank may also be considered). Home schooled students can apply. Contact Recruitment Specialist. You must be committed to completing a degree at NPC and willing to participate in honors program activities.

The number of new scholarship awards is limited to 12 per year. <u>Priority</u> is given to <u>early</u> applicants.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: April 6, 2018

## **Requirements**

- Each semester you <u>must</u> enroll in the one credit Honors Colloquia, a series of courses especially designed for President's Scholars.
- 2. Be a full-time student on track to earn a degree in four semesters (an average of 16 credits per semester is necessary to complete a degree program in four semesters).
- 3. Maintain at least a 3.25 grade point average (GPA) while at NPC.
