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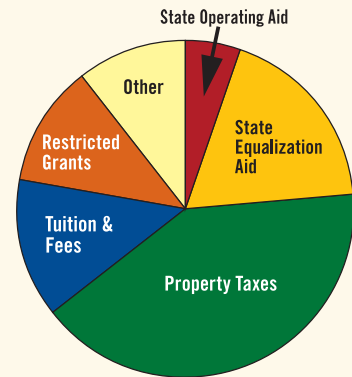
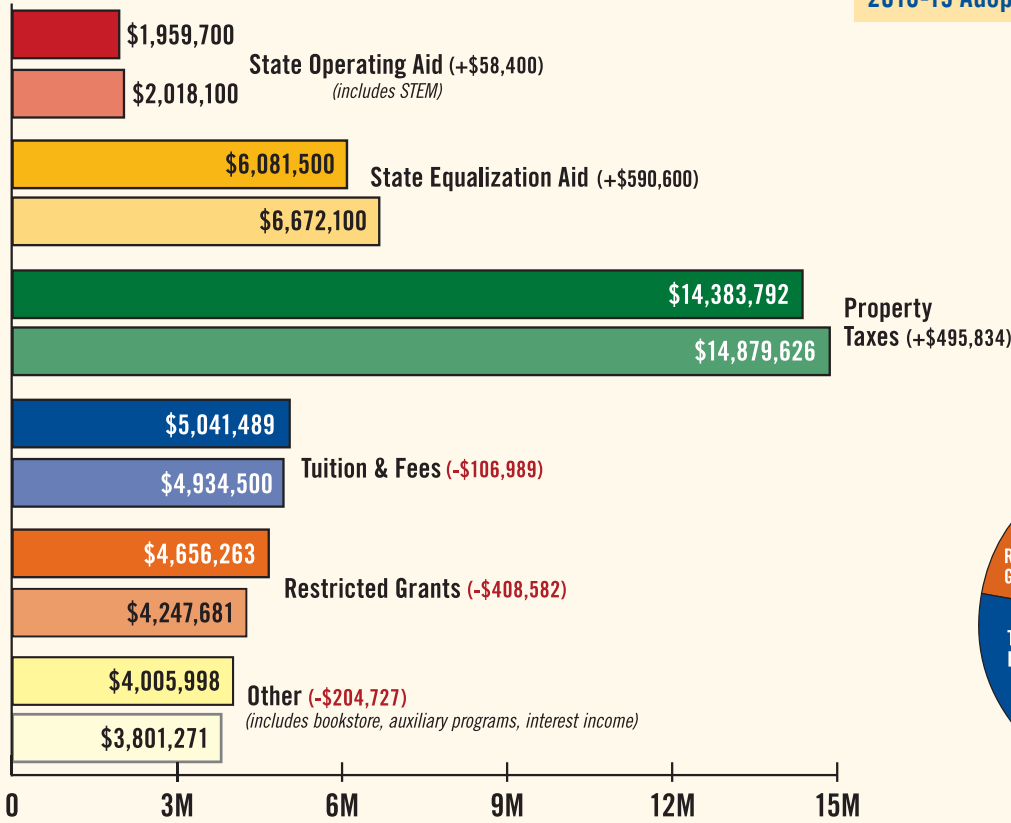
NPC Revenue Sources

Dual Enrollment/NAVIT Agreements:

NPC partners with 21 area high schools to allow students to earn college credit while attending high school (dual enrollment). NPC also partners with Northern Arizona Vocational Institute of Technology to bring vocational training to 12 area high schools.
