

NPC FRIENDS AND FAMILY LEG-UP SCHOLARSHIP

\$500 toward tuition, books and fees for the SPRING 2020 semester

One scholarship to a student at each campus, and one scholarship to a student at each center each semester. This is a need-based scholarship, for students who are <u>ineligible for the PELL</u>, but who can demonstrate financial need.

Criteria:

Degree-seeking at NPC. Demonstrate financial need. This is a NEED-based scholarship. Successfully completed prior credits at NPC at the time of application. Enrolled for 6 or more credits at NPC. Cumulative Grade-Point Average of 2.0 or better. High school diploma or GED[®]. Not in default of a student loan and not in overpayment status. Students who have previously obtained a Bachelor's degree should contact Betsyann Wilson. Students currently in high school at the time of award are not eligible to apply.

You must have written proof from the NPC Financial Aid Office that <u>you are <mark>NOT</mark> eligible to receive the Pell</u> <u>grant</u>. <mark>Please request and obtain this proof (financial aid denial letter) <u>before applying for this scholarship.</u> <u>If you are unable to complete the FAFSA, due to circumstances beyond your control, please contact Betsyann</u> <u>Wilson at 928-536-6245 prior to submitting your application.</u></mark>

How Do You Apply?

Submit all **application documents electronically** to <u>betsy.wilson@npc.edu</u>. Attach all application documents as <u>a single .pdf file</u> in the order given below:

Application documents:

- Completed, signed and dated NPC Friends and Family Scholarship Cover Letter Form
- Essay 500 words or fewer Describing:
 - o What are your career goals;
 - o What are your educational goals;
 - o What resources you have to fund your education making you qualified to receive this scholarship; and
 - o Why the scholarship is needed, and how it will be used.
- Demonstration of financial status as evidenced by letter from NPC Financial Aid Office
- NPC Degree audit (Contact an NPC Academic Adviser)

Application Deadline: Friday, November 8, 2019 at 12:00 p.m. MST., for funding for the Spring 2020 semester. Applications received after this date/time will not be accepted, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date! If you submit your application prior to Monday, October 28, 2019, and it is incomplete or requires revisions, Betsyann Wilson will make every effort to assist you in making corrections. Applications received after October 28, 2019 will be accepted "as is."
