Claude Millet Endfield Early Childhood Development Scholarship

Established by the friends of Claude Endfield

To honor her long career and her service and devotion to NPC Early Childhood Education students, and especially to little children across Northeastern Arizona

Award Amount: \$500 per semester for one semester: FALL 2020. Scholarship recipients may re-apply for the award in subsequent academic years (not to exceed <u>two consecutive semesters</u>).

Criteria:

- 1) A degree-seeking student in Early Childhood Development at NPC at the time of award.
- 2) Enrolled in at least three credit hours at NPC during the semester of the award.
- 3) A minimum G.P.A. of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale at the time of application.
- 4) Demonstration of financial need through completed FAFSA.
- 5) In good academic standing, not in default on student loan(s) or in overpayment status.
- 6) Students who have previously obtained a Bachelor's degree or who will still be enrolled in high school at the time of *award* are not eligible to apply.

How Do You Apply?

Submit all application documents electronically to <u>betsy.wilson@npc.edu</u>. Attach all application documents as <u>a single .pdf file</u> in the order given below – Paper applications will not be accepted; your campus office or advisor can assist you in scanning the documents as required:

Application documents:

- Completed, signed and dated NPC Friends and Family Scholarship Cover Letter Form
- Essay 500 words or fewer Describing:
 - o What are your career goals;
 - o What are your educational goals;
 - o What resources you have to fund your education making you qualified to receive this scholarship; and
 - o Why the scholarship is needed, and how it will be used.

Please include in the essay if you know Claude Endfield personally, and, if so, how she may have influenced your educational and/or career goals.

- Demonstration of financial status as evidenced by Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Student Aid Report (SAR) or letter of award from NPC Financial Aid Office or MyNPC page.
- NPC Degree audit (Contact an NPC Academic Adviser) or your unofficial transcript from <u>https://mynpc.npc.edu/ics</u> indicating your degree intent.

In addition, **TWO letters of reference** are required to be sent <u>directly from the referrer</u> to <u>betsy.wilson@npc.edu</u> prior to the deadline date. One letter should be from NPC faculty or staff, and one from a representative of the field of Early Childhood Development.

Application Deadline: Thursday, April 16 at 12:00 p.m. MST., *for funding for the Fall 2020 semester*. Applications received after this date/time *will not be accepted*, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date!
