



The Charles E. Lisitzky Memorial Scholarship

Charles E. Lisitzky was a longtime resident of Holbrook, Arizona, and an advocate of lifelong education. This scholarship was established in his memory to assist Native American students in their pursuit of a college degree.

It will provide \$500 toward tuition, books and fees for the **Fall 2020** semester.

Who is eligible to apply? NPC Native American Students – Navajo, Hopi or White Mountain Apache – are welcome to apply, so long as they meet the following criteria:

- Degree-seeking at NPC. Must submit a degree audit with application – see **How do I apply?**
- Enrolled for 6 or more credits at NPC during the semester of award.
- **Cumulative Grade-Point Average of 2.0 or better.**
- High school diploma or GED®.
- In good academic standing, not in default of a student loan and not in overpayment status.

Students who have previously obtained a Bachelor's degree or who will not have a high school diploma by the date of award are not eligible to apply.

How Do You Apply? Submit all application documents electronically to betsy.wilson@npc.edu. **Paper applications will not be accepted; your campus office or advisor can assist you in scanning the documents as required: Attach all application documents as a single .pdf file in the order given below:**

Application documents:

- Completed, signed and dated NPC Friends and Family Scholarship Cover Letter Form
- Essay – 500 words or fewer – Describing:
 - o What are your career goals;
 - o What are your educational goals;
 - o What resources you have to fund your education making you qualified to receive this scholarship; and
 - o Why the scholarship is needed, and how it will be used.

Please include in the essay if you knew the Lisitzky Family personally, and, if so, how they may have influenced your educational and/or career goals.

Scholarship recipients may re-apply for the award in subsequent academic years (not to exceed TWO consecutive semesters).

- Demonstration of financial status as evidenced by Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Student Aid Report (SAR) or letter of award from NPC Financial Aid Office or MyNPC page.
- NPC Degree audit (Contact an NPC Academic Adviser) **or** your unofficial transcript from <https://mynpc.npc.edu/ics> indicating your degree intent.

Application Deadline: Thursday, April 16 at 12:00 p.m. MST., for funding for the Fall 2020 semester. Applications received after this date/time will not be accepted, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date! If you submit your application prior to Monday, March 30, and it is incomplete or requires revisions, Betsyann Wilson will make every effort to assist you in making corrections. Applications received after Monday, March 30 will be accepted “as is.”
