Pres Winslow Memorial Scholarship

Established by the family of Prescott Winslow

In Memory of his devotion to the students of Winslow High School and Northland Pioneer College

Award Amount: \$1,000 per semester for one semester. Scholarship recipients may re-apply for the award in subsequent academic years (not to exceed TWO consecutive semesters).

Criteria:

- 1) Applicant must be a degree-seeking student at Northland Pioneer College at the time of award.
- 2) Applicant must be enrolled in at least six credit hours during the semester of the award.
- 3) Applicant must have a minimum G.P.A. of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale at the time of application.
- 4) Applicant must demonstrate financial need through completed FAFSA.
- 5) Applicant must be in good academic standing, not in default on student loan(s) or in overpayment status.
- 6) Students who have previously obtained a Bachelor's degree or who will still be enrolled in high school at the time of *award* are not eligible to apply.

How Do You Apply? Submit all application documents electronically to betsy.wilson@npc.edu. Paper applications will not be accepted; your campus office or advisor can assist you in scanning the documents as required: Attach all application documents as a single .pdf file in the order given below:

Application documents:

- Completed, signed and dated NPC Friends and Family Scholarship Cover Letter Form
- Essay – 500 words or fewer – Describing:
 - o What are your career goals;
 - o What are your educational goals;
 - o What resources you have to fund your education making you qualified to receive this scholarship; and
 - o Why the scholarship is needed, and how it will be used.

Please include in the essay if you knew Pres Winslow personally, and, if so, how he may have influenced your educational and/or career goals.

- Demonstration of financial status as evidenced by Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Student Aid Report (SAR) or letter of award from NPC Financial Aid Office or MyNPC page.
- NPC Degree audit (Contact an NPC Academic Adviser) or your unofficial transcript from <https://mynpc.npc.edu/ics> indicating your degree intent.

Application Deadline: Thursday, April 16 at 12:00 p.m. MST., for funding for the Fall 2020 semester. Applications received after this date/time will not be accepted, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date! If you submit your application prior to Monday, March 30, and it is incomplete or requires revisions, Betsyann Wilson will make every effort to assist you in making corrections. Applications received after Monday, March 30 will be accepted “as is.”
