# Recommendation to Approve Native Environmental, LLC to Clean Welding Shops

### **Recommendation:**

Staff recommends approval to hire Native Environmental, LLC (Native) to clean the welding shops in Holbrook and Show Low for the total cost of \$70,550. Native is on a state contract. The funds for this activity will come from contingency.

### **Summary:**

After the fire at the St John's welding shop, NPC's insurance provider requested an air quality swab testing. The results indicated there were some elevated heavy metals. The insurance company provided a vendor to clean the welding shop. NPC determined it was prudent to also have the welding shops in Holbrook and Show Low inspected and cleaned. NPC is developing new cleaning and safety standards for heavy metal in the welding workshops.
