Not in default of a student loan and not in overpayment status. Over the credit limit OK.

Students currently in high school at the time of award are not eligible to apply.

Applicants must have the recommendation of at least two individuals, including NPC faculty or staff or ECD professionals, as evidenced by letters of support, sent directly from the authors to <u>betsy.wilson@npc.edu</u>.

- Essay 500 words or fewer Addressing the following:
  - What are your career goals;
  - What are your educational goals;
  - What resources you have to fund your education making you qualified to receive this scholarship; and
  - Why the scholarship is needed, and specifically how it will be used.
  - If you personally know Claude Endfield, please describe how she has helped you and/or influenced your education and career goals.
