2021 Graduate of Snowflake High School

Enrolled for 6 or more credits at NPC during the semester of award.

Cumulative Grade-Point Average of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale.

Not in default of a student loan and not in overpayment status.

Students who will be going on a mission in the year following high school graduation may apply for the scholarship, and if awarded, may defer the award until they return from their mission and enroll at NPC.

- Two letters of recommendation, sent from the authors directly to betsy.wilson@npc.edu; One must be from a high school or college instructor and one from the recommender of the applicant's choice.

Application Deadline: Thursday, April 15 at 12:00 p.m. MST., for funding for the FALL 2021 semester. Applications received after this date/time will not be accepted, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date! If you submit your application prior to Monday, April 5, and it is incomplete or requires revisions, Betsyann Wilson will make every effort to assist you in making corrections. Applications received after Monday, April 5 will be accepted "as is."
