\$750 toward tuition, books and fees for the FALL 2022 semester

One scholarship to a student at each campus, and one scholarship to a student at each center each semester. This is a need-based scholarship, for students who are <u>ineligible for the PELL</u>, but who can demonstrate financial need. Criteria:

Degree-seeking at NPC.

Demonstrate financial need. This is a NEED-based scholarship.

Successfully completed prior credits at NPC at the time of award.

Enrolled for 6 or more credits at NPC during the semester of award.

Cumulative Grade-Point Average of 2.0 or better.

High school diploma or GED[®].

Not in default of a student loan and not in overpayment status. Over the credit limit OK.

Students who have previously obtained a Bachelor's degree should contact Betsyann Wilson. Students currently in high school at the time of award are not eligible to apply.

You must have written proof from the NPC Financial Aid Office that <u>you are NOT eligible to receive the Pell</u> <u>grant</u>. Please request and obtain this proof (financial aid denial letter) <u>before applying for this scholarship.</u> <u>If you are unable to complete the FAFSA, due to circumstances beyond your control, please contact Betsyann</u>

Paper applications will not be accepted; your campus office or advisor can assist you in scanning the documents as required: Attach all application documents as a single .pdf file in the order given below. You may take your application to a campus or center and request that the front office or library scan them as a single .pdf file as follows:

Scholarship recipients may re-apply for this award in subsequent academic years (not to exceed <u>four consecutive</u> <u>semesters).</u>

Application Deadline: Thursday, April 14 at 12:00 p.m. MST., for funding for the FALL 2022 semester. Applications received after this date/time will not be accepted, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date! If you submit your application prior to Monday, April 4, and it is incomplete or requires revisions, Betsyann Wilson will make every effort to assist you in making corrections. Applications received after Monday, April 4 will be accepted "as is."
