The Charles E. Lisitzky Memorial Scholarship

One scholarship to one NPC student/semester: \$500 toward tuition, books and fees for the FALL 2022 semester. Charles E. Listizky was a longtime resident of Holbrook, Arizona, and an advocate of lifelong education. This scholarship was established in his memory to assist Native American students in their pursuit of a college degree.

Criteria:

NPC Native American Students – Navajo, Hopi or White Mountain Apache

Degree-seeking at NPC.

Demonstrate financial need. This is a NEED-based scholarship.

Successfully completed prior credits at NPC at the time of award.

Enrolled for 6 or more credits at NPC during the semester of award.

Cumulative Grade-Point Average of 2.0 or better.

High school diploma or GED[®].

Not in default of a student loan and not in overpayment status. Over the credit limit OK.

Students who have previously obtained a Bachelor's degree should contact Betsyann Wilson. Students currently in high school at the time of award are not eligible to apply.

Scholarship recipients may re-apply for this award in subsequent academic years (not to exceed <u>two consecutive</u> <u>semesters).</u>

Application Deadline: Thursday, April 14 at 12:00 p.m. MST., for funding for the FALL 2022 semester. Applications received after this date/time will not be accepted, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date! If you submit your application prior to Monday, April 4, and it is incomplete or requires revisions, Betsyann Wilson will make every effort to assist you in making corrections. Applications received after Monday, April 4 will be accepted "as is."
