The Mary Kay Smith Lindy Nursing Scholarship

This scholarship was established by the family of “Kay” Smith Lindy in memory of her lifelong career as a nurse. It will provide \$500 toward tuition, books, fees and related expenses to a Native American student enrolled in the NPC Nursing Program for the 2022-2023 academic year.

Who is eligible to apply?

NPC **Native American** nursing students, either enrolled in (second-year) or accepted for (first year) the NPC ADN program who meet the following criteria:

- Enrolled in or accepted for the NPC ADN program – **submit transcript or acceptance letter with application**
- Enrolled full-time in NPC ADN program during the academic year of the award
- **Cumulative G.P.A of 3.0 or better** on a 4.0 scale
- Not in default of a student loan and not in overpayment status.
- Preference is given to students who can demonstrate financial need.

How do I apply?

Submit all application documents **electronically** to betsy.wilson@npc.edu. **Paper applications will not be accepted; your campus office or advisor can assist you in scanning the documents as required: Attach all application documents as a single .pdf file in the order given below. You may take your application to a campus or center and request that the front office or library scan them as a single .pdf file as follows:**

 - What are your educational goals that will lead you to your career as a nurse?

Application Deadline: Thursday, April 14 at 12:00 p.m. MST., for funding for the FALL 2022 semester. Applications received after this date/time will not be accepted, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date! If you submit your application prior to Monday, April 4, and it is incomplete or requires revisions, Betsyann Wilson will make every effort to assist you in making corrections. Applications received after Monday, April 4 will be accepted “as is.”
