Apply for Paramedic Program – Requirements include

- Proof of citizenship as demonstrated by an AZ driver's license or Arizona State ID.
- Completed EMT 130 & 131 OR EMT 175 with C or better and/or be an Arizona-certified EMCT with a minimum of 1 year of experience.
- NPC Reading Placement Exam of 249 or better using Accuplacer Plus.
- Current negative TB skin test or chest x-ray; MMR x 2, Hepatitis B or declination, Tdap, and Varicella. Covid vaccination or waiver will be required.

	EMT 246 Paramedic Training I	Meets 2 full days per week Fall semester Pre-requisites: Admission to program, DPS level 1 fingerprint clearance and random urine drug screening prior to clinical. Clinical and vehicular hours are scheduled outside of class time and in addition to the 2 class meetings/week. Travel outside of Navajo County will be required.	20

	EMT 247 Paramedic Training II	Prerequisites: EMT 246 and current AZ EMCT certification Clinical and vehicular hours are scheduled outside of class time and in addition to the 2 class meetings/week. Travel outside of Navajo County will be required. Completion fulfills the AZ Department of Health Services mandatory requirement of a minimum of 500 hours of didactic and a minimum of 500 hours of clinical and vehicular hours and provides the option to test for certification by the National Registry of EMTs.	22
