- Applicants must have the recommendation of at least one individual, including NPC faculty or staff or ECD professionals, as evidenced by a letter of support.

Scholarship recipients may re-apply for this award in subsequent academic years (not to exceed <u>two consecutive</u> <u>semesters</u>).

Application Deadline: Thursday, April 18 at 12:00 p.m. MST., for funding for the FALL 2024 semester. Applications received after this date/time will not be accepted, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date!
