Your campus office staff, library staff, or academic advisor can assist you in scanning the documents as required:

Application documents (4):

- 1. NPC Friends and Family Scholarship Cover Letter Form (must be completed, signed, and dated)
- 2. Essay 500 words or fewer Describing:
 - What are your career goals;
 - What are your educational goals;
 - What resources do you have to fund your education making you qualified to receive this scholarship;
 - Why the scholarship is needed, and how it will be used.

The key to the scholarship essay is that it is a personal narrative, reflecting your experiences and goals. DO NOT USE ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE, SUCH AS CHAT GPT, to write your essay. It is important that your personal voice come through!

- **4.** Your unofficial transcript from https://mynpc.npc.edu/ics indicating your degree intent. If you do not yet have a transcript at NPC, submit a degree plan (see academic advisor).

Application Deadline: Thursday, September 4th at 12:00 p.m. (noon) MST., for funding for the FALL 2025 and SPRING 2026 semesters. Applications received after this date/time will not be accepted, regardless of why they are late. You are STRONGLY advised to submit your application well in advance of the deadline date!
