Blocks are suggested for full-time students, but may be adjusted based on course scheduling, student employment, or individual needs.

NPC does not offer a degree specific to biology. Students interested in biology and related degrees should pursue the Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) requirements for an Associate of Science degree, and plan to transfer to another institution to complete a bachelor's degree in biology.

Depending on transfer goals, students eligible to take more advanced math classes should aim to get through MAT 231 (Calculus II) by the end of the third semester. MAT 160 could be an alternative to MAT 231.

If students intend to pursue a healthcare-related field, we suggest taking BIO 201 and BIO 202 (Human Anatomy and Physiology I and II, respectively).
