<u>College & Career Preparation – 2025-2026</u>: Blocks are roughly based on six credit enrollments per semester, but may be adjusted based on course scheduling, student employment, or individual needs. These pathways are meant to provide a general outline of CCP classes per each pathway; students' course schedules may reflect some or all of these classes.

#### Pathways:

- Literacy & English Language Learners: For those whose English literacy levels are below a third grade reading level or for non-Native English speakers
- ABE/ASE: For those whose placement scores for reading, writing, and/or math place them at or below an 8th grade level
- HSE/GED-Prep: For those seeking a high school diploma, either through the GED or one of the HSE pathways, and whose placement scores are at or above a 9<sup>th</sup> grade level.
- College Prep: For those with a high school diploma/equivalency needing additional skill development before placing into college-level courses; placement scores are at or above the 9<sup>th</sup> grade level

\*Note: Placements and grade level equivalents determined by students' scores on the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE). Students are post-tested after completing their CCP course or after their instructor feels they've mastered class content; together with instructors' recommendations, these placement tests determine which class students next need to take depending on their pathway. Classes may also be interchangeable based on students' needs. Students must meet with Learning Assistants and Success Coach to create a personalized plan of their pathway.
