NPC does not offer a degree specific to chemistry. Students interested in chemistry and related degrees should pursue the Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) requirements for an Associate of Science degree, and plan to transfer to another institution to complete a bachelor's degree in biology.

Students eligible to take more advanced math classes should aim to get through MAT 231 (Calculus II) by the end of the third semester. MAT 160 also is suggested.
